§ Participation in the "Health Meeting for thalidomiders in local districts"

Members of the research staff have been participating in the Health Meeting for thalidomiders in local districts for the promotion of health and the improvement of ADL in thalidomiders in cooperation with "Ishizue." Participating members include the head of the research group and rehabilitation experts of the same group, who have attended the meetings of 5 local districts, speaking casually with thalidomiders and providing individual advice on health and physical problems.

§ Exchanges with foreign experts

We are maintaining cooperation established by the former research group with experts in European countries, and mutually exchanging useful information. A member of the research group, Dr. Haga, attended the international symposium, "Mobility Maintenance of People with Thalidomide Embryopathy," held by Dr Beyer in Hamburg in September 2017.

§ Health and Life Survey

We conducted a health and life survey of thalidomiders living in Japan to identify areas in which individuals are struggling and to compare the results with those obtained in a survey conducted 5 years ago. A questionnaire was sent in late December, 2017, and collected by the end of January 2018. The results will be analyzed later.
